IDEAL FOR

- · Addressing heavy-duty stains like smoke or water damage.
- Oil performance with a water-based formula.



IDEAL FOR

- · Interior and exterior use.
- · Fast drying, multi-surface primer-sealer and stainblocker.



IDEAL FOR

- · Moisture-prone and high-humidity
- · Stainblocker that resists mold and mildew growth on the primer film.



IDEAL FOR

- · Interior and exterior use on multi-surfaces.
- High hide formula for color change and blocking medium to heavy stains.



IDEAL FOR

- · Difficult surfaces like glossy finishes, PVC, or metal.

Gather your tools

- Brushes: High-quality brushes are essential for cutting in around edges and in tight spaces. A 2-3 inch angled brush is versatile for most projects.
- Rollers: For larger surfaces, a roller can make the application quicker and more efficient. Use a roller with the appropriate nap length for your surface; smoother surfaces require a shorter nap.
- Paint Tray: Essential for holding primer and rolling out excess before application.
- Sandpaper: After the primer dries, use a finegrit sandpaper (around 220 grit) for smoothing out any bumps or imperfections.
- Drop Cloths: Protect your floors and furniture from drips and spills.
- Painter's Tape: Mask off areas you don't want primed, such as trim or windows.
